
Overview

Why ICAM?

The work of the FICAM program is foundational to current White House cybersecurity priorities.

-  One of three Cybersecurity Cross-Agency Priority Goals
-  Critical to Federal Information Security Management Act (FISMA) and Continuous Diagnostics and Mitigation (CDM)
-  Enables and secure government transactions with citizens and partners (e.g., Connect.Gov).
-  Facilitates secure cloud computing and shared services
